

## **BASIC SEARCH STRATEGY IN 7 STEPS**

STEP 1

Analyse your topic

STEP 2

Create a search strategy

STEP 3

Choose relevant search tool(s)

STEP 4

Search needed information

STEP 5

Evaluate result

STEP 6

Get the materials

STEP 7

Evaluate materials and your sources

Before you begin looking for information, you need to analyse the topic

Understand the scope of the topic and what its related subject area

**Keywords**: Keywords are significant words which can be used as search terms in online catalogues or databases



## **IDENTIFYING KEYWORDS, SYNONYMS AND RELATED TERMS**

Determine whether there are synonyms, related terms, or other variations of the keywords that should be included.

#### **THESAURUS**

Thesaurus is a book of synonyms, often including related words/concepts (to get proper term)

#### **DICTIONARY**

A reference book containing an alphabetical list of words, with information given for each word, usually including meaning, pronunciation, and etymology.

#### **ENCYCLOPEDIA**

Provide information that is general, but brief. They provide an excellent place to start research. If the keywords you choose do not give you the results you need, try these suggestions:




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 BOOLEAN OPERATORS - logical search operators that allow you to narrow or broaden search.


A Drug Use



B Alcohol Addiction


Narrows a search: Each result contains all search terms

A Alcohol Abuse



B Drug Abuse Broadens a search: Each result contains at least one search term

A Addiction



B **Alcohol**  Narrows a search:
Results do not contain the specified


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2. PHRASE SEARCHING: Exact matches on words within a phrase search (with double quotes) get a higher relevancy boost over the same words in non-phrase searches (without double quotes).

**Example:** 

- "development disabilities"
- "learning disabilities"



For example: "learning disabilities" will search for results in which the words learning and disabilities appear next to each other.

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# 3. TRUNCATION - place a symbol at the end of the word

Truncation is a searching technique used in databases in which a word ending is replaced by a symbol. Frequently used truncation symbols include the asterisk (\*), a question mark (?) or a dollar sign (\$).

If you want to search for several words that have the same stem, using truncation can save time.

#### **Examples:**

- □ Nutri\* retrieves words starting with NUTRI such as NUTRIA, NUTRIENT, NUTRIENTS, NUTRITION,
- gene\$ will search for results containing;
  - ☐ gene, genes, genetic.
- ☐ Bio\* will search for results containing;
  - □ biology, bionic, biosynthesis, biophysical

Truncation can sometimes find irrelevant records.

Different databases use different truncation symbols so it is important to check the database 'Help' information or 'Search Tips' for details about which symbol to use.






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# 4. WILDCARDS: place a symbol within a word



Different databases use different wildcards symbols so it is important to check the database 'Help' information or 'Search Tips' for details about which symbol to use.

**Wildcards** are symbols used in database search to represent a letter or letters in a word.

Find variation of spelling (singular/plural)

Find variation of language spelling (American/British)

Frequently used wildcard symbols include the question mark (?), the pound/hatch symbol (#) or the asterisk (\*).

#### **Examples:**

- Analy\*e will search for results containing the words;
   analyze, analyse (s,z)
- Wom?n will search for results containing;
  - √ women, woman (e, a)

- The quality and format of information you find on the Internet may not be appropriate for use in the academic context.

REMEMBER: Citing your information sources will avoid plagiarism and respect the Intellectual Property and Copyright issues

Is the amount right for the length of the paper and the time you have?


results have the quality you want?

Did you find what you expected to find?

Ask yourself

Are they useful for your paper?

Exclude articles that did not meet the criteria determined.

# **Authority/Credibility**

author's credentials, known or respect authority, indexed in Scopus and Incites JCR

Does the author provide references for quotations and data?

Is it accurate? Is it supported by evidence?

# **Accuracy**

up to date, factual, comprehensive

# **Support**

listed sources, contact information

## Reasonableness

fair, balanced, objective, no conflict of interest, concerned with the truth

Based on your topic, is the information current enough?
