INTRODUCTION



Turnitin is an originality checking and plagiarism prevention service that checks your writing for citation mistakes or inappropriate copying.

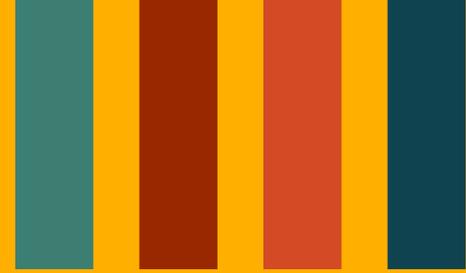
When you submit your paper, Turnitin compares it to text in its massive database of student work, websites, books, articles, etc.

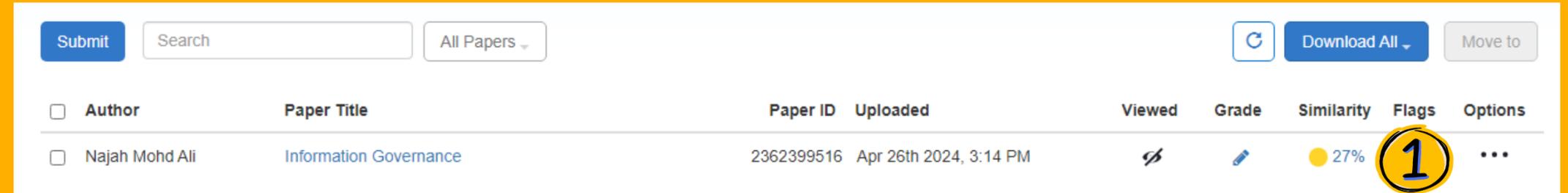

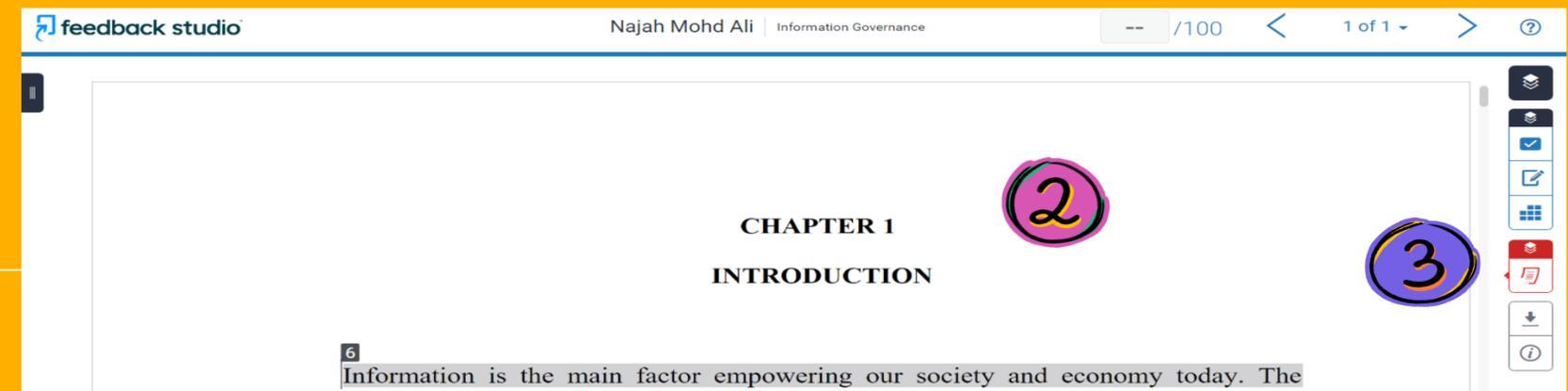

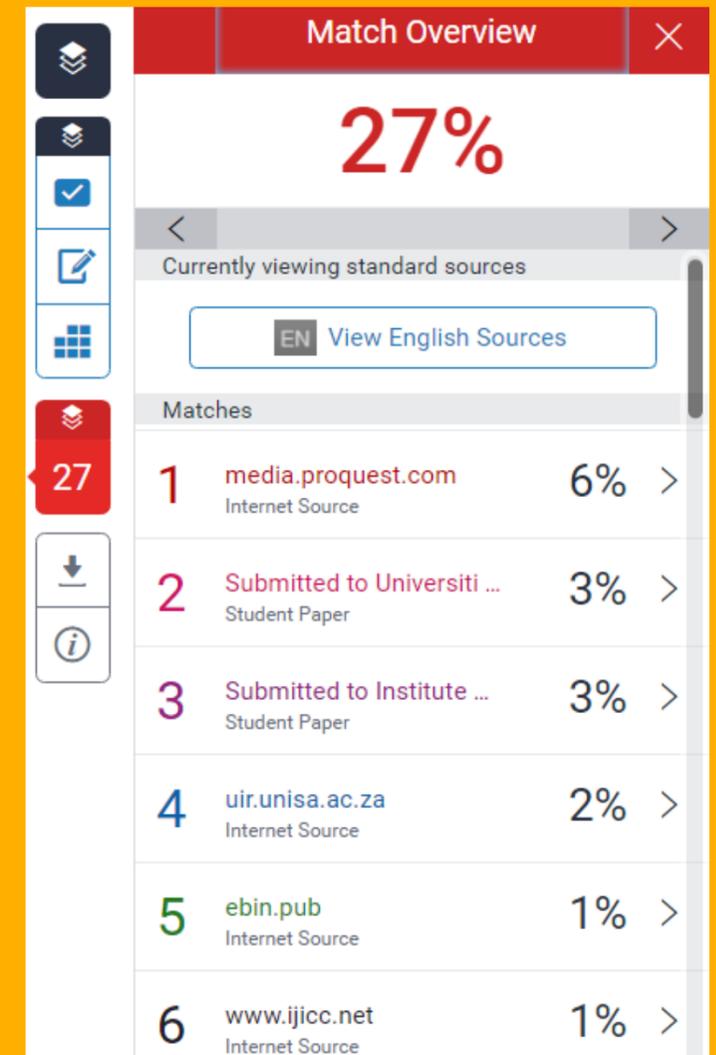
2 This is the document viewer. The document viewer allows instructors to access each Turnitin product in one location and view all the products simultaneously as layers.

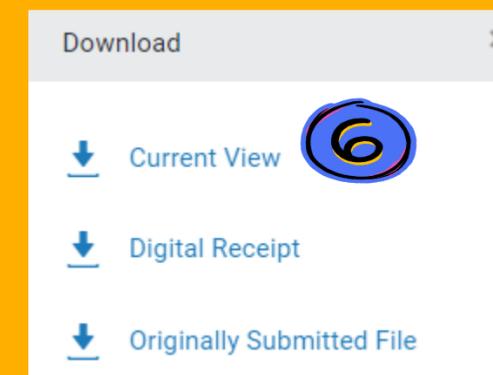

Excluding an Individual Source



Sometimes, you may notice that a source is included in the Similarity Report that you didn't intend, or there may be a source you think was permissible. You don't want it to contribute to the overall similarity score.

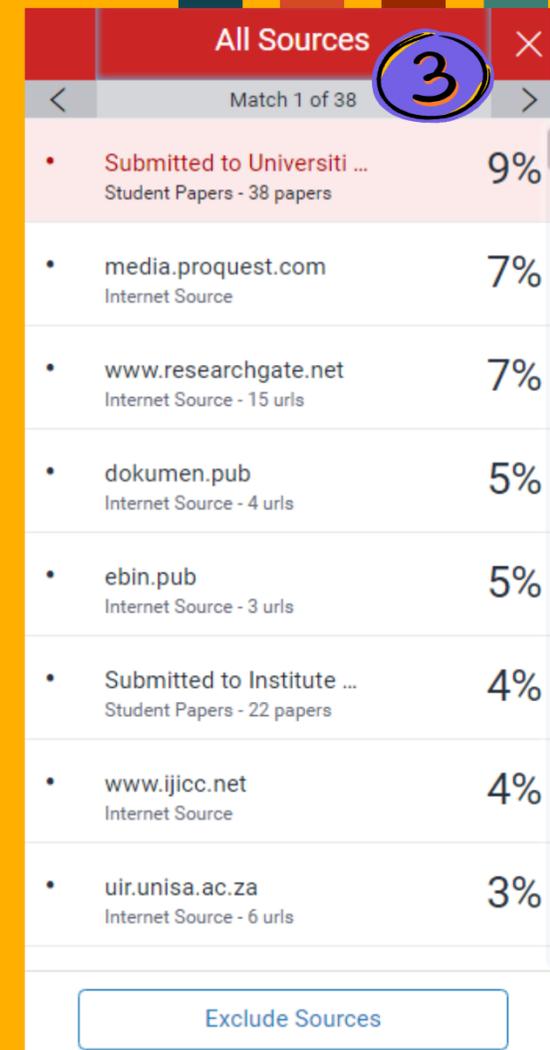
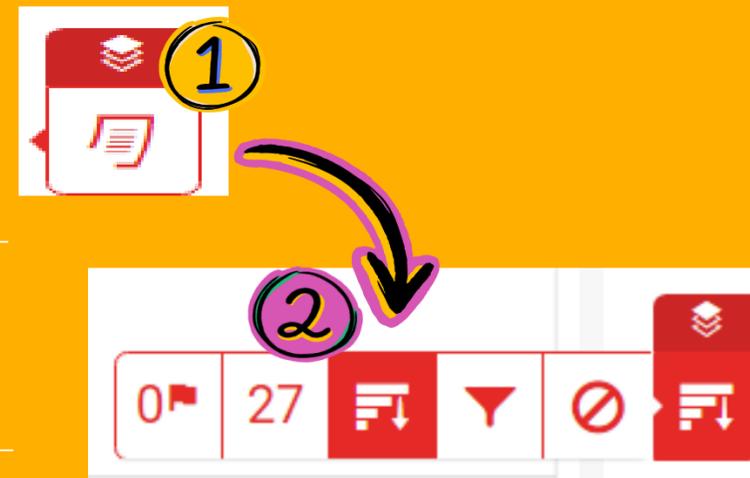


Excluding an Individual Sources

1 Select on the arrow icon. The overlapping sources are listed below the top source.

2 Click **All Sources**.

3 Click **Exclude Sources**.



Excluding an Individual Sources

4 Select the checkbox for each source you would like to exclude.

5 Then click **Exclude**. If the sources that were excluded affect the Similarity Index, it will recalculate and display a new percentage of matching content.

6 You're all done! The similarity score will be updated to reflect the exclusion you have just made.
